


Studley Wood Seniors golf newsletter - September 2025

Awaydays and Tours

We had a very successful tour to Bournemouth and Awayday at Calcott Park. In contrast to last year, we had excellent weather for both events.

September Tour - Bournemouth (7 – 8 September 2025)

After a long hot and dry summer, we were anxious that the good weather would linger on for a few days more while we were on our tour centred in Bournemouth. For the most part it did with just a couple of light showers on our first course at Bulbury Woods. As its name suggest many of the fairways were lined with trees which suited the straight hitter! The nearest the pin on the 10th proved too much of a challenge for us. Some of us were inches away from the green, but no-one actually made it on. So this was carried forward to Crane Valley Golf Course

Crane Valley course on the second day was a more crafted course, and a different challenge. A course with some interesting holes and more varied than Bulbury. We fitted in the nearest the pin as a nearest the pin in two on the 18th. This time we were able to award all the NTP prizes.

After an evening at Harry Ramsden's on the sea-front in Bournemouth, on the final day we travelled (across the chain ferry) to the Isle of Purbeck Golf course. By far the more difficult of the





courses. It had tremendous views of Studland Bay beach and beyond. On this course we had a nearest the pin and a nearest the pin in two on the 18th. This was on the basis that all the other par threes were too difficult!! On the 18th, the green was clear until Russel, in the penultimate group, played two tremendous shots to be within a few feet from the pin. Tim, in the last group made a valiant effort to beat Russel, but failed.



The hotel in Bourmouth was central with a large car park underneath and walking distance to the two restaurants where we ate: the Coconut Tree, (where a small group of us led by me got completely lost) and Harry Ramsden's - when we could squeeze Tim and a few retrogrades out of a local real ale pub.

Results

Martin Wilkinson was awarded the prize as overall winner, but after a recount when we got home we realised that Gary Chalmers had in fact won. Martin was very magnanamous in realising he had only held the trophy for one night and the trophy was properly awarded to Gary in the clubhouse a day or two later in the presence of Martin.
